
Keidanren's Initiatives to Nurture Global Talents

Keidanren Scholarship Program to Nurture Global Talents

- Objective: Encourage Japanese undergraduate/graduate students to study abroad, by awarding a 1 million yen scholarship to each student per year.
- Eligible Applicants:
- ✓ Undergraduate/graduate students enrolled in the designated 47 universities, hoping to study abroad through their universities' study abroad program.
- ✓ Students with ambition to become future leaders in the global business of Japanese corporations.
- ✓ Students with ability to adapt to foreign cultures, overcome differences in values and ways of thinking arising from cultural backgrounds.
- Awardees: For the fiscal year 2016, 36 students have been selected out of 193 applicants, following document screening and personal interviews.
- Supports for Scholars:
- ✓ A pre-departure orientation.
- ✓ Advice / counseling on their study plans and future career plans via SNS.

Development of a curriculum of credit courses to nurture global-minded human resources

- □ **Objective**: In order to produce more students who will be leaders in global business, Keidanren works with universities to develop a curriculum of credit courses. In the courses, corporate executives as well as corporate administrators and experts give lectures.
- ☐ "Issues in Global Business and Career Development" at Sophia University
 - In cooperation with Sophia University, Keidanren opened a course entitled "Issues in Global Business and Career Development" in October 2012. The quota of students for the course was set at 30 to ensure two-way dialogue.
 - 8 member companies of Keidanren participated, giving lectures on the current situation of their global business, challenges they were facing, and ways to overcome them, in an effort to convey to the students the skills they need to acquire to become future global leaders.

Encouraging High School Students to Study Abroad



- □ UWC (United World College), a private, international educational institution headquartered in London, has 15 colleges (high schools) around the world.
- □ UWC Japan National Committee was established in 1972, with full support from Keidanren. It has been active in selecting and nominating qualified students to UWC colleges, and in raising scholarship funding for the selected students. It has sent 538 students to overseas UWC colleges in total (19 in FY 2015).
