

Sea Lanes Connecting the Gulf of Aden and the Persian Gulf to Japan

O Gulf of Aden: Strategic point of maritime transport, which connects Asia to Europe via the Suez Canal The Gulf is such a vast stretch of waters (about 900 km long and up to 400 km wide) that it is difficult to effectively take measures to control piracy.

O Persian Gulf: Important sea route for transport of energy resources such as crude oil and LNG to Japan 88 percent of crude oil Japan imports is transported through the Persian Gulf.








Piracy Has Expanded to Cover Indian Ocean (2008~2011)






